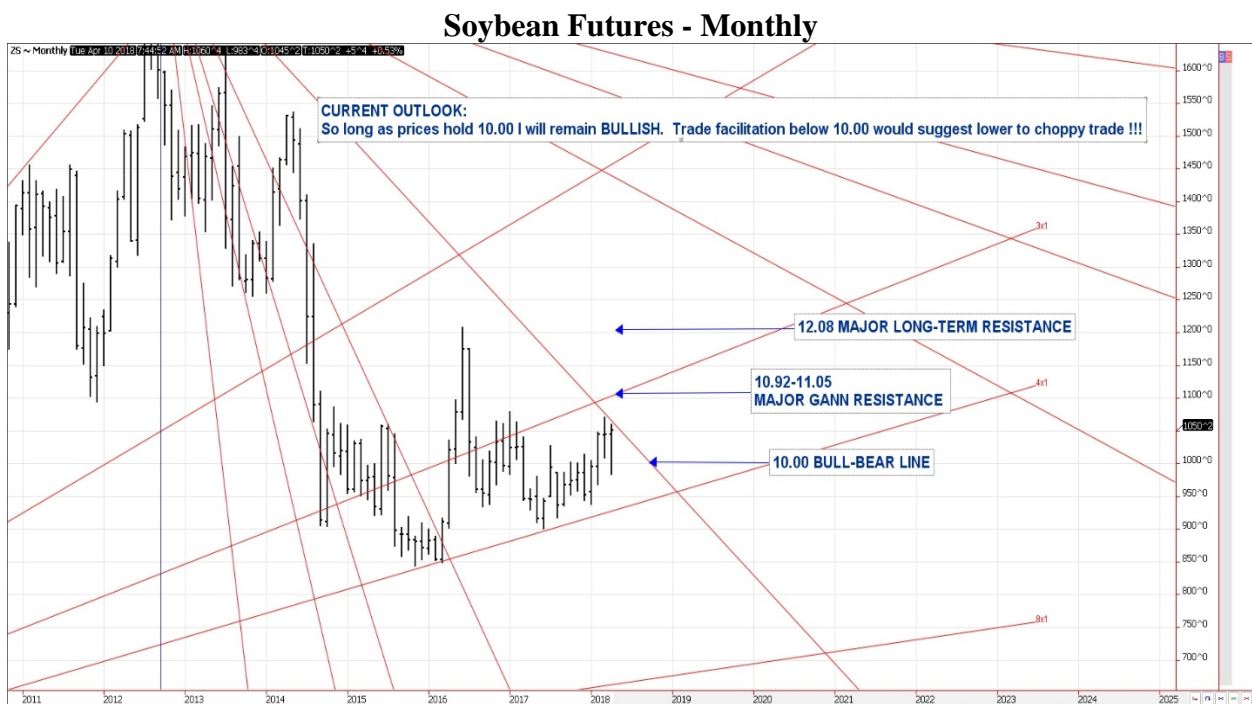


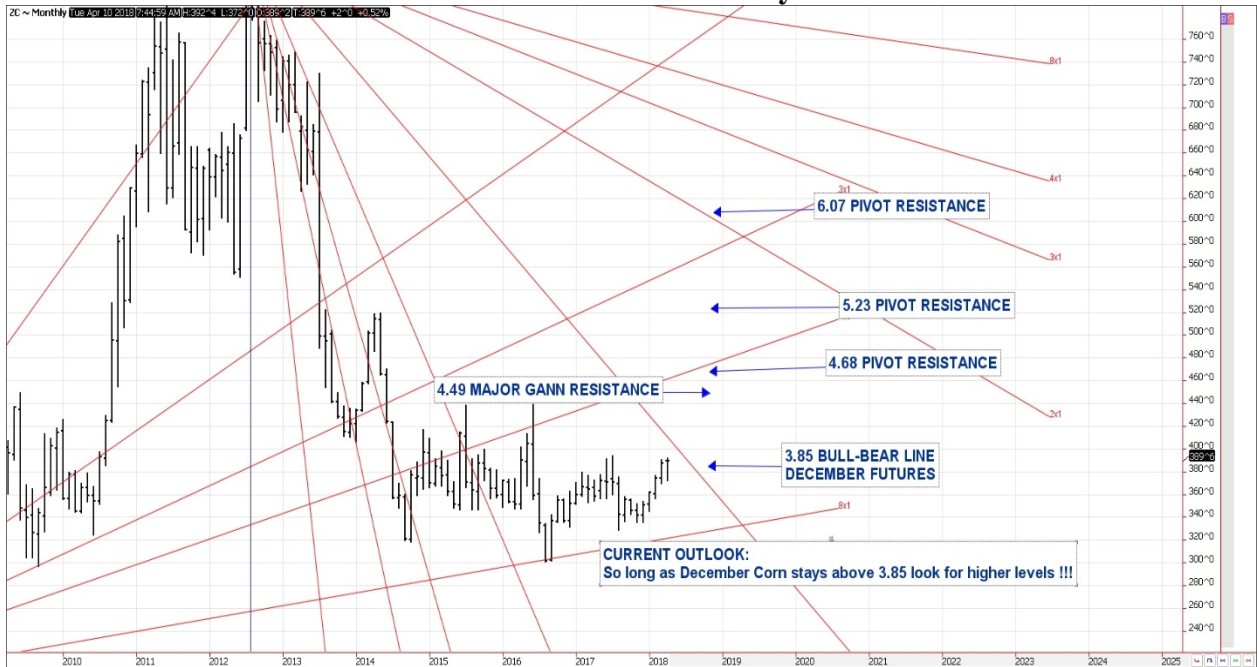
The Technical Aspects of Soybeans, Corn and Wheat
